Role purpose:

To lead the development and delivery of a range of projects that cover common components of a range of projects transforming ex-industrial spaces in and around Brymbo.

Specific responsibilities:

- Development and delivery of quarterly activity plans relating to schools, interpretation, signage, training, technical support and feasibility studies;
- Engage, involve and sustain people in processes of change linked to physical spaces in their communities;
- Promoting principles of asset based community development;
- Deliver in line with (and further strengthen) the Trust's volunteering policies;
- Ensuring tight integration with wider project team;
- Development of links with strategic and operational partners including schools, learning providers, museums and countryside services;
- Coordination of specific packages of externalised work, providing input and oversight;
- Financial management of the capital and revenue budgets associated with the 'connections' projects;
